**SCHOOL INFORMATION**

Assumption Grammar School is a Catholic voluntary grammar school for girls founded in 1933 by the Missionary Sisters of the Assumption. In September 2009, Assumption became a Specialist School for Music with Physical Education. Pupil enrolment is 910.

The school offers a full range of state of the art facilities to support a full, broad and balanced curriculum. There is in place an infrastructure that enables the school to be forward thinking in curricular and business terms while remaining true to the values established by the Missionary Sisters of the Assumption over the past three quarters of a century.

The whole staff and community work as one team which embraces the school's "Fully Alive" ethos. This ethos is characterised by the strong pastoral care dimension which permeates every aspect of school life. All members of the school community share responsibility for maintaining the caring atmosphere of the school and each staff member, teaching and support, is expected to be guided by this in all dealings with the pupils.

**MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT**

The Mathematics Department in Assumption Grammar School is highly successful with a rich history of outstanding performance. All teachers have new classrooms, positioned together on the upper floor of our new development. Each classroom has its own Promethean board and computer loaded with general and specialist software. The staff members, in addition, all have an iPad.

At Key Stage 3 the classes are unstreamed and there are five forms in each year group. Years 8 and 9 have six periods of Mathematics per week and Year 10 have five periods. (*Periods alternate with thirty and thirty five minutes.*)

At Key Stage 4 all pupils take GCSE Mathematics and, in addition, some choose to take GCSE Further Mathematics. Those opting for Mathematics have five periods per week, while those taking Further Mathematics currently have ten periods.

At post 16 level, both Mathematics and Further Mathematics are offered to AS and A-Level and are taught by highly-experienced, specialist teachers. Mathematics continues to be among the most popular options at A-Level. Support classes are available to those pupils who wish to take Mathematics to A-Level without having taken GCSE Additional Mathematics.

Pupils throughout the school engage in a range of enrichment activities, including the UKMT Mathematical Challenges.
